The two large categories of nouns are proper nouns and common nouns. Common nouns can be classed as concrete, abstract, or collective.

- 1. Proper nouns name particular things and are capitalized.
- 2. Common nouns name general classes of things.

Concrete nouns name physical things that can be seen, touched, or tasted (*tree, plate, flower*).

Abstract nouns name concepts, qualities, or conditions (*strength, wisdom, beauty*).

Collective nouns name collections of objects (*flock, choir, audience, family*).

Exercise:

In the following excerpt from "The Ugly Duckling" by Hans Christian Andersen, list each of the common nouns in italics and identify as concrete, abstract, or collective.

In this snug *retreat* sat a *duck* upon her nest, watching for her young *brood* to hatch; but the *pleasure* she had felt at first was almost gone; she had begun to think it was a wearisome *task*, for the little ones were taking so long to come out of their *shells*, and she seldom had *visitors*. The other ducks liked much better to swim about in the *canals* than to climb the slippery banks, and sit under the burdock leaves to have a *gossip* with her. It was a long *time* to stay so much by herself.
